stagecoach to Marion County... Henry hired Chinese, who lived in the barn, to help dig out oak grubs from the farm. The oaks had first been chopped off at the top of the ground. CONFEDERATE MISSOURI TROOPS

1st Regiment, Missouri Cavalry

1st Cavalry Regiment was formed during summer of 1861. Many of its members had served with the Missouri State Guard. The unit fought at Elkhorn Tavern, then moved east of the Mississippi River and was dismounted. After fighting at Iuka and Corinth, it was assigned to M.E. Green's Brigade, Department of Mississippi and East Louisiana. It took an active part in the fight at Big Black River Bridge and on July 4, 1863, was captured at Vicksburg . After the exchange it was assigned to General Cockrell's Brigade, and consolidated with the 3rd (Samuel's) Missouri Cavalry Battalion. It fought with the Army of Tennessee throughout the Atlanta Campaign and was part of Hood's operations in Tennessee. Later it was involved in the defense of Mobile. On May 4, 1862, the regiment contained 536 effectives and lost 9 killed and 54 wounded at Corinth. The 1st/3rd Battalion reported 25 killed, 80 wounded, and 3 missing during the Atlanta Campaign and sustained 56 casualties at Allatoona. The small command surrendered with the Department of Alabama, Mississippi, and East Louisiana. The field officers were Colonel Elijah Gates; Lieutenant Colonels Richard B. Chiles, George W. Law, and William D. Maupin; and Majors Robert R.

Arrived in Oregon 01 September 1852. According to family tradition, Lorenzo Dow Heater actually made the trip across America to Oregon three times (Charles Morley; April, 1987). I have so far been able to document the fact that L.D. Heater came to Oregon with two of his brothers and their families in 1850; leaving Des Moines, Iowa in May of that year. An interview with Rebecca Heater Hess in 1933 reveals that her father was in California at the gold mines. I suspect that he went with Martin Shuck, who was the father-in-law of Lorenzo's brother, Benjamin. I have found documentation that "Mr. Shuck went from California to the Isthmus of Panama, walked across, and went from there to Iowa." Rebecca Heater Hess stated that her father returned home to Iowa in the Fall of 1851. The following Spring the family left Iowa for Oregon, travelling across the plains to the Willamette Valley by ox team and prairie schooner. Lorenzo bought the 320-acre Donation Land Claim of Jimmy Male. Jimmy was a cousin of Sophia Morley Heater, and had come to Oregon in 1850 with Sophia's brothers, William and John Morley.

Mr. Heater was born in Viginia, in 1819. At the age of 15 years with his parents moved to Iowa. He was one of the early pioneers of Oregon, having crossed the plains with ox teams in 1850. After a stay of one year here he went to California, and from that state he went to Iowa returning to Oregon with his family in 1852. He settled on the donation land claim in the Waldo hills where he has lived until the time of his death.

He leaves four children, one son and three daughters, all are living. The funeral was conducted yesterday at Union Hill cemetery.

"Death has claimed another victim. Mr. Charles Patten, a deacon of the Baptist church, died on Tuesday morning, aged eighty years. Mr. Patten spent the flower of his days on his farm in Dumfries, where he laboured hard, making a fine home for himself. Having sold his place for a good figure fifteen years ago, he came to spend the remainder of his days in Drumbo. His wife died about ten years ago. He leaves a family of seven boys to mourn his loss. His oldest son, David, has always remained home and is still on the farm here."

Woodstock Sentinel-Review obituary 04/24/1891 Friday

"Charles Patten of Drumbo, father of W.C.Patten of this place, died on Tuesday. Funeral Thursday. Mr. Patten and Mr. Baker were men of wide acquaintance and highly respected by all who knew them."

N.B.-Charles was dismissed by letter from the St.George Baptist church in 1846 which I presume must have been about the time he moved to the Oxford County, Drumbo area. It is also noted in the Baptist archives that Mary (his wife) was also dismissed in 1846 from St.George so I presume they were already married in the St.George area (Dumfries anyway) prior to 1846 and moved to Oxford together.

From "Historic Armstrong B.C. and Its Street Names"

Although Patten Drive is a relatively new street, its namesake was one of Armstrong's earliest settlers. Levi William Patten and his family arrived in the area in August of 1883. Alfred Postill, a relative and friend of Levi's wife, Emily, had asked Mr. Patten to manage his sawmill at Deep Creek. He quickly agreed and the Pattens, with their three children, Edward W., Charles J., and Lee A., came west from Ontario. Patten Drive is named after the middle child, Charles. The family travelled by rail through the United States to Portland, Oregon where they boarded a steamer to Victoria. From Victoria they took a boat passage up the Fraser River to Yale and then rode on a stage to the Okanagan Valley.

Mr. Patten managed the sawmill for five years and then decided to purchase property next to the sawmill and built a custom gristmill. Levi Patten was the first person in the north end of the Valley to install proper facilities and the gristmill ran on power generated by the waterwheel. During the day the water power was required by the sawmill so the gristmill was operated at night. Mr. Patten continued to operate the sawmill for the next 22 years and the gristmill until a more modern flour mill was established in Enderby. The lumber that Levi produced in the sawmill was the lumber used to build the steamers which sailed on the rivers and lakes of the Okanagan Valley.

Levi Patten was originally from Oxford County, Ontario, where he was born on August 19, 1845. Mr. Patten taught school there for some years before becoming a flour miller. On March 17, 1867, Levi William Patten and Emily Louise Robson were wed at the home of Edward Postill, the bride's uncle. Miss Robson was born in Malton, England in 1849. She immigrated to Canada and was adopted by the Postill family. After their arrival in Lansdowne, Mr. and Mrs. Patten became active community members in the pioneer village. Mr. Patten served the municipality as clerk, Reeve, and building inspector. He was also the police magistrate until he was forced to give up the position due to failing health. As a former teacher, Mr. Patten was interested in children and education and was a member of the school board. He was also an agent for the Wawanesa Mutual Fire Insurance Company and a member of the Spallumcheen Farmers Intitution. Well-known for his accurate shooting, Mr. Patten was an enthusiastic member and supporter of the Armstrong Gun Club. He was also keenly interested in weather observation and submitted a monthly weather report to the newspaper. Another of Mr. Patten's interests was the Agricultural Fair, the forerunner of the Interior Provincial Exhibition. He was the president of the local Conservative Club and belonged to the congregation of the Zion United Church.

Levi Patten lived and worked in the Armstrong area for 52 years. He died on May 25, 1936 having been predeceased by his wife, Emily, in 1907. A true pioneer, Levi William Patten leaves behind a long record of service in the community which was carried on by his son Charles.

According to the obituary of his brother Judson A. Patten in 1925, Levi and another brother, John, owned and operated the Harrow grist mill for a time in Essex county.
The following sent to me by H.I.E.R.S in 1997.

"In 1874, Alfred L. Munger sold a half acre of land on King Street, 358 feet west of the Queen Street corner, to Levi William Patten, to build the three storey `Harrow Steam Flouring Mill'. This same year, a mill owned by Samuel Hughson operated in East Haeeow, and a third at Oxley was owned by Hugh and Joseph Russell. Four years later, the Harrow mill was sold to Josiah Rumball, and in 1886 it had changed into a roller mill and was owned by Sylvester McLean in partnership with others."

"There are three splendid grist mills in this township. One at Harrow is owned by Mr. Levi Patton, one east of Harrow, owned by Mr. Samuel Hughson, and a third at Oxley, owned by Russell Bros."

"I.W. [should read L.W. I imagine] Patton & Brother, of the Harrow Grist and Flouring Mills, are doing a heavy business. On Tuesday, 354 bushels of wheat and Wednesday 181 bushels."

Reply by Elaine Woods(nee Georgena Patten), "Got Emily's wedding date from a type-written note from my Dad. So there is the possibility it is wrong. I note that their first child was born in Nov 1869, which is about 8 months after your wedding date. But as you know, the first one can come anytime!"

N.B.-Their marriage date is rather confusing as now I have 2 conflicting sources, verbally from John Marley and Elaine Woods against what I have recorded from the Kent County Register and the Christian Messenger.

The following from Elaine Woods(nee Georgena Patten) regarding Emily's mother's name being Elizabeth- "I have a small Bible, which has on the front page the name Elizabeth Robson, with the rest of the page torn out. On the remainder written upside down is "my mother & father married" and "Oct 24, 1844". On the next page is written, apparently in her handwriting "Emily Robson, Malton, England (Yorkshire)."

I (Jeff Patten) also asked of Elaine if she knew if Emily was adopted, and she had this to say- "the "adoption" information comes from a letter from Dorothy Postill Birrell, written to Dad and me in 1983 saying that Emily was not "formally adopted". She did not think people bothered as much about that in those days. In another letter later in 1983 she says "there is no word of when Emily joined them or why, but when they (Postills) left Yorklshire for Canada she was with them." Dad always call Dot Birrell a cousin. Both of us used to write to her. I don't remember when she died, but think some time after Dad, who died in 1984. I am still trying to firm up the tenuous connections I have between the Postills and the Pattens".

Notes for Charles F. Patten:

According to the obituary of Amelia (Minnie) in the Amherstburg Echo February 23/1877, she was the sister of Dr.C.F. Patten of Harrow. According to the obituary of his brother Judson A. Patten (1925), Charles was mentioned again as having practised medicine in Harrow but was already deceased by then.

Sent to me by H.I.E.R.S. (Harrow Early Immigrant Research Society) in 1997 was some excerpts from a book (probably a Harrow historical tome) relating to Patten/Pattons in the area and the following are about Charles I believe.

"Dr. C.F. Patten, graduate of Trinity Collage, Toronto, was here in 1875 and 1876. It is not known how long he stayed. In 1888, Dr. George McKenzie of Poplar Hill was here, but in 1889 his place was taken by Dr. Nathaniel Mitchell..."

"One of the earliest forms of life and casualty insurance was supplied by the fraternal lodges. In 1889, C.F. Patten recieved \$100 from the AOUW (Workman) Relief Association for injuries he had recieved."

Perhaps Charles was a doctor in Harrow until 1888 when he had an accident of some sort and his position as doctor was covered by George McKenzie. It mentions that he didn't recieve payment for injury until 1889 when another doctor came. Perhaps at that time Charles's injuries were deemed to interfere with his doctoring and a permanent replacement was given the job. All conjecture on my part however. The only other mention of Doctor Patten that I have at this time is an Amherstburg Echo article dated July 1/1876 "Gilbert

Bernard of Colchester...arm broken when threshing clover...caught between the driving belt and the whirl...set by Dr. Patten of Harrow."

It seems that Mr. Patten, who has been in frail health for some years, went there from Regina the week before, accompanied by Mrs. Patten, to spend the winter. He was quite exhausted by the trip, and the morning after, without taking any rest, went down to the city for some paint supplies. On Sunday he became seriously ill and gradually became worse until death came. The funeral was held on Monday, the 19th, under Masonic auspices, and his remains were placed in a vault for the time being, until Mrs. Patten decides whether she intends to return to Regina or remain in Los Angeles. Mr. Patten was a native of St.George, Ont., and came to Amherstburg nearly half a century ago. He was a double cousin of the late Judson S. Patton, prominent farmer of Malden, and the late Myles Patton, ex-reeve of Colchester South, their fathers having married three sisters. Two brothers of Mr. Patten, subject of this memoir, Levi and John, once owned and operated the Harrow grist mill, at that time located across the road from where the Baptist church now stands. Another brother, Dr. Charles Patten, now deceased, was a practising physician in Harrow, while his sole surviving brother is Dr. Joseph Patten, of Detroit. He married in Amherstburg Miss Margaret Hendron, daughter of the late Mrs. Thos. Armitage, Malden. Four children were born to them here--Josie, Mrs.----- deceased; Walter (Bud), who was killed on a railway accident in the Northwest; Gussie, Mrs. Cook, of California; and Eva, Mrs. Lucker, of Regina. Mr. Patten was a painter and decorator and an artist of rare ability. He took an active interest in municipal affairs and was Mayor of Amherstburg in 1899. He was prominent in Masonic circles and during the year 1883---93 presided as W.M. of Thistle Lodge. In 1900 the family moved to Regina, where he recieved a Government position in the Lands Titles office. He recieved gradual promotion and at the time of his death was Deputy Registrar for the Provincial Government, in charge of a large staff of employees.

According to a bit sent to me from H.E.I.R.S., Judson was a Councillor in Colchester Twp. (before being split into south and north) in 1874, 1875, 1876 and was a Deputy Reeve in 1879. I believe he remained active in local politics in Colchester N. but do not have that information at hand.

Neighbors on each side were son William Morley and his family, son John Morley, and James Hunt and his family.

On April 14, 1850, Moses Morley started for Oregon, leaving most of his family behind. He arrived in Oregon October 2, 1850. Catharine arrived to join her husband September 1852. He apparently died before she arrived. He probably had other children before William who did not come to Oregon. Moses and Catharine Wadkins Morley had a total of 13 children. (Question: Moses arrived in Oregon Territory

October 1850, but is also listed in the 1850 census with his family in Iowa--likely he was listed there, even though he wasn't actually physically present). Some of this information may be in error, as Moses, William, and John are all listed in the 1850 Oregon Territory census, which was taken in January 1850.

This large farm was located south of Silver Falls Highway. It was directly opposite where Drift Creek Road joins the Silver Falls Highway. The farm was bordered on the west by Carter Road and on the north by the Silver Falls Highway. Henry Carter later bought a farm (Thomas Fine's old place) just one section to the west on the Highway, and Jacob Scott's farm (Thomas Coon's land claim) was just a few hundred yards east of the Morley place on the Highway. The farm was divided and sold, and by 1878 was owned by the Nott, Saunders, Hayer, and Hannah families.

"Closely identified with the farming interests of Marion County is John Morley, who is pleasantly located about three miles northeast of Silverton, where he is prosperously engaged in the pursuit of agriculture. He is numbered among the veteran farmers of the county who have labored with unceasing toil in their chosen vocation, and are now enjoying comfortable competencies, acquired chiefly by their own efforts. Of goof old Virginia stock, he was born May 9, 1823, in Jackson County, Ohio, a son of Moses Morley. Obtaining his early education in the district schools, and remaining on the old home farm in Ohio until twenty one years of age. He then left the parental roof and began the battle of life for himself, working for wages the first three years thereafter. In 1847, following the tide of immigration westward, he and two boys by the name of Darst, started for Oregon, crossing the plains with an ox cart, and being four months on the road. They crossed the Missouri River at St. Joseph May 5, 1847 and reached the Willamette Valley September 5, 1847. older residents of this city. In an early day Mr. Cooper was a prominent business man in this city.

Mrs. Cooper is a sister of Uncle John Morley of Abiqua.

She leaves a husband 71 years of age and eight children to mourn her loss.

"A Pioneer Lady Passes Away

Mrs. James Cooper died on her golden wedding anniversary.

The busy and eventful life of Mrs. James Cooper is ended. Born in Vermillion County, Ohio,

on March 4, 1833 she would have reached the ripe old age of 66 years next month.

In early life she moved with her parents to Iowa and was one of the pioneers of that state. On February 23, 1849, she married James Cooper at Mount Pleasant, Iowa and the two have lived together for fifty years, death calling her to her reward on her golden wedding anniversary, Tuesday, February 23, 1899. Of this union nine children were born, one now dead and eight living, all of whom except William, now in Nevada, were at her bedside when the angel of death beckoned her spirit to the better _____. The children present were Mrs. Mary Woolen, George, William, Walter, Isaac, Jasper, James and Frank Cooper. Mrs. Cooper also had several sisters and one brother who are living in Iowa, Illinois, Oregon and California.

Her life has been an eventful one. Crossing the plains with a large number of neighbors and other eastern people in 1853, and settling in Marion county, Oregon, during the fall of that year, she may be called one of the pioneers of that state. During that long and tedious journey of six months there were many incidents to try the metal of strong hearted men, but the ladies in the train were ever ready to face the dangers and endure all hardships for the purpose of securing a home of their own in the land 'where rolls the Oregon' without complaint, and Mrs. Cooper was one of them. During the trip she witnessed several fights with the Indians in which a number of the redskins were sent to their happy hunting grounds and several members of the train were killed. Fording swollen streams and facing other dangers were incidents of common occurance, and it was while wending their way up the banks of Green river that her son George was born.

In 1871, Mr. and Mrs. Cooper gathered their family and worldly possessions together and removed from Oregon to Walla Walla, Wash., settling the following year in Whitman county where they remained until 1891, when they came to Coeur d'Alene. When they settled in Whitman country the Palouse country was undeveloped and considered fit only for a cattle range.

The funeral takes place today at 2 o'clock p.m., from the family residence. Services will be conducted by Rev. T. G. Hodgson, with interment in the post cemetery.

Mrs. Cooper was a lady of excellent character, and has been an invalid for over a year. She leaves a husband 71 years of age to mourn the loss of a life companion. The family has the sympathy of a large circle of friends and acquaintences in their deep sorrow."

Some controversy apparently exists concerning Elizabeth Wilson. One researcher believes her name was actually Elizabeth Dow. Peter Heater served in the war of 1812, having been drafted at Harrision County, Virginia. He is probably buried in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery in Iowa. Peter left his farm to Noah, after the other boys moved to Oregon. Hiram lived in the Salt Lick area of W. Virginia, near the town of Heaters. The family lived in Virginia Territory, now Braxton County, W. Virginia, before they moved to Iowa. (Information provided by Flodene Heater Jarvill, 1987)

Heaters, West Virginia is on State Highway 19, just east of Interstate 79, about halfway between Charleston and Clarksburg in central West Virginia.

The family moved from Virginia to Henry County, Iowa in 1838. Hiram remained in (West) Virginia.

Peter Heater served in the War of 1812 in the company commanded by John Bozart in the 5th Regiment of V.W. commanded by Lt. Col. W.L. Street. He served from Aug. 30 to Dec. 10, 1814. He was ill and received an honorable discharge. In 1850, 1855, and 1856 he appeared before the clerk of the District Court of Henry County in Iowa and received an affidavit of his identity for the purpose of obtaining bounty land according to the Act passed September 28, 1850. Information from Jeff Patten:

According to a letter from Diane Patten Guyatt McDougall in August of 1997, James Patten's father was a William Patten. William is listed in the 1785 census of Stafford County Virginia as "three white souls, no slaves, one dwelling" and is supposed to be the only Patten in Virginia at that time. This info comes by way of Benjamin Patten (Diane's grandfather) and his uncle Walter (a son of Aaron) who apparently made a trip to Virginia at one time to learn more of the roots of the family. Their findings were handed down through Frank to Harold Cherry and in turn to Diane. In any event, James and Deborah came to Canada in 1804 to Jerseyville, and in 1824, settled on Lot 3, Conc.III in South Dumfries, Brant County. That last being corroborated by several sources, so quite likely the first is equally as accurate.

"JAMES AND HIS FAMILY ARRIVED IN SOUTH DUMFRIES IN 1923. THEY HELPED BUILD THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH IN 1824 WHERE THE CEMETERY NOW STANDS. JAMES MOVED TO NEW JERSEY WITH AN UNCLE. HE MET DEBORAH WILLISON AND WANTED TO MARRY. THEY WERE QUAKERS AND HER FATHER REQUESTED THAT JAMES WORK FOR HIM FOR THREE YEARS BEFORE HE WAS ALLOWED TO MARRY. AFTER LEVI'S BIRTH THEY MOVED TO UPPER CANADA. THEY STAYED AT ANCASTER SEVERAL YEARS. THEN BOUGHT THE FARM IN ST. GEORGE IN 1831. THEY HAD FAMILY REUNIONS IN

It says in the Canadian Baptist Archives that Deborah was received by letter in 9/15/1832. Subsequent correspondance to the CBA finds that they do not have the actual letters as they are just alluded to in the Church minutes. Deborah is mentioned in the St.George record Aug.18/1827 "... and sister Patten all in default for not attending to church meeting. The Church decide by excluding them." She was, as mentioned before,

restored to church membership in 1832. As per to the 1861 census she was living with her son Hugh the year she died.
